An initiative spurred by meetings held in January and March of this year has culminated in the "reorganization" of the Minden Soaring Club, Inc. (MSC). MSC has existed as a SOI(c)(3) non-profit corporation since 1999, but has been quiet for the past several years. During the March meeting held in Soaring NV's hanger, a new Board of Trustees was elected, and this Board selected new officers. The new officers and board members include Tip Russell-President, Don Marshall-Vice President, Linda Mae Draper-Secretary, Reba Coombs-Treasurer, Fred LaSor-Trustee, John "Bumper" Morgan-Trustee, and Miriano Ravazzolo-Trustee.

The impetus for MSC's revitalization stems from encouragement provided by Laurie Harden and Fred LaSor of Soaring NV, and the support of the Minden-Tahoe Airport manager, Bobbi Thompson. We also owe Mr. Bob Semans a special debt of gratitude for sharing his time, experience, and insights in helping reconstitute MSC.



Our organization's mission is to promote recognition of Minden, NV and its soaring infrastructure as a world-class soaring center, provide education enhancing pilot safety and proficiency, promote the sport of soaring through events and seminars, serve as a beacon to encourage others to become active members in the soaring community both as pilots and non-flying advocates, and also serve to promote our community and the splendor of our area.

The club has set several priorities meant to help it reestablish itself as a presence in the Minden soaring/ aviation community. These include reinvigorating the membership base, sponsoring and/or hosting soaring events, hosting/co-hosting social events that promote safety, education, and community, as well as reaching out to all soaring pilots within our region, nationally, and internationally. In an effort to create a more accurate aircraft registration database, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is requiring re-registration of all civil aircraft over the next three years and renewal every three years after that. The final rule can be found at:
